MEETING MINUTES SANITARY AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 97 OF SARPY COUNTY, NEBRASKA

The meeting of the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 97 of Sarpy County, Nebraska was convened in open and public session at 12:00 p.m. on July 20, 2021, 11440 West Center Road, Suite C, Omaha, Nebraska.

Present at the meeting were Kevin Coats, Gary Sleddens, Dick Heideman, and Shellie Zeeb. Absent was Andrew Barry. Also, present were Mark Johnson, attorney for the District, Bob Czerwinski of E & A Consulting Group, Inc., engineer for the District, Adam Flanagan of Kuehl Capital Corporation, the District's Financial Advisor, Karen Gibler, SID Liaison, representing Hawaiian Village Lake Association, and a representative from People's Services

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the *Gretna Guide & News* on July 7, 2021, a copy of the Proof of Publication being attached to these minutes. Notice of the meeting was simultaneously given to all members of the Board of Trustees and a copy of their Acknowledgment of Receipt of Notice is attached to these minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the published notice and in the notice to the Trustees of this meeting. All proceedings of the Board were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

The Clerk then certified that notice of this meeting had been given to the Sarpy County Clerk at least seven days prior to the date set by the Board of Trustees for this meeting and filed his Certificate to that effect, said Certificate being attached to these minutes and made a part hereof by this reference.

The Chairman called the meeting to order and called the roll of Board members.

Purchasers of the General Fund Warrants are advised to consult their tax advisors as to the tax consequences of purchasing or holding the General Fund Warrants.

- iv. Trees/shrubs planted south of WWTP fence and watering system placed and operational;
- v. Catwalks for WWTP fabricated and installed;

- vi. Boat Storage Area maintenance SID paid for rock and executed weed spraying while trailers were removed;
- vii. People's Service –3-year agreement renewal, Matt Wilson replacement identified and in-place, and phone lines repaired for lift stations.
