MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF SANITARY AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 97 OF SARPY COUNTY, NEBRASKA HELD AT 5:00 P.M. ON JUNE 16, 2015 AT 8335 PLATTEVIEW ROAD, PAPILLION, NEBRASKA

The meeting of the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 97 of Sarpy County, Nebraska was convened in an open and public session at 5:00 p.m. on June 16, 2015, at the Sarpy County Sheriff's Station, Papillion, Nebraska, 68046.

Present at the meeting were Trustees Jeff Warinski, David Barry, and Ken Brison. Also present the District's attorney, Brian Doyle, and the District's Engineer Bob Czerwinski. Joy and Rene Nelson of Urban Utilities were also present. Trustee Aaron Raszler is deceased and the remaining Trustees elect to operate with four Trustees until the next election of the District, which is occurring in September of 2015.

The Chairman then publicly stated to all in attendance that a current copy of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was available for review and indicated the location of such copy in the room where the meeting was being held.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in <u>The Papillion Times</u> on June 10, 2015, a copy of the Proof of Publication being attached to these minutes. Notice of the meeting was simultaneously given to all members of the Board of Trustees and a copy of their Acknowledgment of Receipt of Notice is attached to these minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the publicized notice and in the notice to the Trustees of this meeting. All proceedings of the Board were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

The Clerk then certified that notice of this meeting had been given to the Sarpy County Clerk at least seven days prior to the time set by the Board of Trustees for this meeting and filed the Certificate to that effect, said Certificate being attached to these minutes and made a part hereof by this reference.

Upon motion made by Trustee Barry and seconded by Trustee Warinski, the Board voted three (3) "ayes" and zero (0) "nay" to appoint Ken Brison as acting chairman to sign minutes, warrants and related materials presented at these proceedings.

The Board then heard the monthly report of Urban Utilities ("UU"). All normal operations. Talked with representative about blowers. They are evaluating onsite. There is concern that the pipes that run underground that bring air in to the blowers for the digester are possibly not functioning as intended. UU then reported that the cross connection surveys a total of 135 have been returned to date.

The Board's attorney advised that he had e-mailed resident regarding BUMP tape at speed table at 85th and Molokai. Request resident to pay for replacement of tape as their contractor caused the damage. The SID's engineer to follow up on cost for replacements.

Speed table paint scheduled for tomorrow but dependent upon rain. Contractor has been delayed by weather.

The Board then discussed further providing for trash service. The Board asked their attorney to get bids and to make sure the bids were comparable in services provided. The Board also discussed the general fund financial analysis provided by its municipal advisor, Kuehl Capital Corporation, and that no tax increase would be necessary to provide trash service based upon past revenue from the general fund and from water and sewer service fees.

The Board then discussed the gate structure between the lake and the Platt River. The District's engineer discussed with gate manufacturer, reviewed plans and specs. The gate only leaks water from the river into the lake when the pressure is high. Leak does not occur from the lake to the river. The gate is keeping fish out of the lake. The Board discussed whether turning the orientation of the gate to prevent leaks from the river into the lake would be prudent. The Board requested its attorney get price to change the orientation of the gate.

Reports from Midwest Laboratories were presented.

The Board then discussed question that had arisen at the HVLA meeting. The Board discussed whether trees by the beach should be removed and/or replaced. Some trustees expressed that the trees drop debris on the beach and that they would prefer that trees removed not be replaced. UU also reported that Health and Human Services doesn't like trees near well head or sewer plants as they create a vulnerability. The Board requested its engineer evaluate trees and provide information to the Board.

The Chairman then presented the following statements for payment from the General Fund Account of the District:

- a.) Urban Utilities, Inc. for WWTP June maintenance, Postal \$3,483.37 Service charges, emergency services, sampling, etc. (#7461).
- b.) Urban Utilities, Inc. for meter reading/invoicing, NE Dept. of Revenue form prep., etc. for May, and support services in remeter reading equipment, etc. (#7462).
- c.) Midwest Laboratories, Inc. for water testing and preparation \$ 111.22 of samples (#764776).
- d.) E & A Consulting Group, Inc. for engineering services relating to general maintenance of the District (#128340, 128341).
- e.) Tri-State Pumping, L.L.C. for sludge removal and hauling from \$440.00 WWTP (No. 2312).

Upon motion made by Trustee Barry and seconded by Trustee Brison, the Board voted three (3) "ayes" and zero (0) "nay" to approve the payments from the General Fund Account of the District. The Clerk was then directed to attach copies of the invoices to these minutes.

After discussion the Resolution contained herein below and by this reference incorporated herein was duly introduced, seconded and upon a roll call vote of "aye" by the Trustees Ken Brison, Dave Barry and Jeff Warinski, , was adopted; the following resolutions were then passed:

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 97 of Sarpy County, Nebraska that the Chairman and Clerk be and hereby are authorized and directed to execute and deliver Warrants No. 4215 through 4219 of the District, dated the date of this meeting, to the payees, for the following services and in the following amounts, said warrants to draw interest at the rate of 7% per annum, said warrants to be payable from the General Fund Account of the District, to be redeemed no later than three (3) years of the date hereof, being June 16, 2018; to-wit:

- a.) Warrant No. 4215 for \$3,483.37 made payable to Urban Utilities for June maintenance, etc.
- b.) Warrant No. 4216 for \$1,246.44 made payable to Urban Utilities for June meter reading services, etc.
- c.) Warrant No. 4217 for \$111.22 made payable to Midwest Laboratories, Inc. for water testing.

- d.) Warrant No. 4218 for \$425.63 made payable to E & A Consulting Group, Inc. for engineering services relating to general maintenance.
- e.) Warrant No. 4219 for \$440.00 made payable to Tri-State Pumping, LLC for sludge removal and hauling from WWTP.







Backflow Preventer

This is a picture of the lawn irrigation system water feed from the house. The backflow preventer is the apparatus on top of the water pipe coming out of the house. Water can flow to the irrigation system, but water cannot flow from the irrigation system back into the house.

Bib Vacuum Breaker

The vacuum hose bib prevents water flowing back into the house from a connected hose, should the hose become higher than the faucet and water pressure coming out of the faucet is less than the pressure of the water in the hose.





Air Gap

An example would be where the drainage hose from the water softener is routed to an open drain, instead of being directly connected into a drainpipe.

What causes cross connections?

Cross connections can be caused by both permanent and temporary "piping". An

example of a cross connection being permanently piped in is the drain on a water softener. Many times these discharge lines are connected directly to the sewer line without any type of protection. Hot tub and whintpool fill pipes and swimming pool and boller make-up lines are other examples of permanently piped cross connections.



The most common example of a temporary piped cross connection is the common garden hose. It is estimated that 90% of all cross connections are caused by the inappropriate use of garden hoses. Garden hoses are frequently used to apply fertilizer and pesticides to lawns and gardens. They are also used to fill swimming pools, wash cars, and in rural areas, they are often used to fill stock tanks for watering cattle, horses, and other livestock. Other temporary piping cross connections occur when hoses are used to fill waterbeds or are connected to utility sinks to fill wash tubs or mop buckets.

What are the consequences of cross connection?

The consequences of cross connections can range from something as simple as "dirty water" to something as severe as serious illness or even deafn. There are many recorded instances of non-hazardous contamination of public water supplies caused by cross connections. In one case, a line used for cleaning a distilling vat in a wine bottling company was left open and an entire vat of wine flowed back into the public water system. Although this was not a health hazard, and most of the customers liked the

water they drank, this cross connection could have had far deadlier results if it had been something other than wine in the vat.

There are many instances recorded where people have been made seriously ill or even died due to cross connections. There have been cases where dysentery, diarrhea, repatitis and even polio have been contracted as a direct result of a cross connection.
